SYNOPSIS OF MARCH **BOARD MEETING**

- Approved motion to accept new wording for the Late Fee Account.
- Approved motion to approve the expenditure of up to \$1,800 including NJ sales tax, delivery, & installation, for BFA. This would cover a 4 tap draft beer tower (and related items) to be installed in the Tiffany Bar. The monies to come from Country Club.
- Approved motion to expend up to \$9,000; all inclusive, for the new heating in the Gold Bar with KB Plumbing & Heating. Monies to be transferred from the Sinking Fund to Country Club & expenses paid out of Country Club.
- Approved motion to hire Olivia Maute as the swim team assistant coach for the 2019 summer season at a salary discussed in closed caucus. Monies to come from line 501.05, salaries. This will not overspend the line.
- Approved motion to purchase 3 new basketball backboards & 2 rims for the courts at the A-Field from Top Hoops at a cost not to exceed \$2200. Monies to come from line 501.02. This will not overspend the line.
- Approved motion to hire Stefo's Pool Service for the summer season at the Circus pool three times a week at a cost of \$4,958.06 including tax. Monies to come from Country Club-
- Approved motion to hire Stefo's Pool Service for the summer season at the Drum pool three times a week at a cost of \$6,610.75 including tax. Monies to come from POA line 503.11. This will not overspend the line.

2019 Boat and Fishing News

LAKE CLOSED

The Lake is closed to ALL fishing Wednesday, April 3 at 5:00 pm until Saturday, April 6 at 8:00 am for Trout stocking.

BOATING RULES & REGULATIONS

All DUES & FINES must be paid in full to obtain a White Meadow Lake 2019 Boat Tag.

- NJ DMV BOAT REGISTRATION & BOAT SAFETY CERTIFICATE are required for GAS & ELECTRIC powered boats to apply for a boat tag.
- BOAT, TRAILER & MOTOR SIZE- Boat & Trailer Length & Width are required. Maximum boat length – 16 ft. Maximum Horse Power – 9.9 HP
- ONLY 2 BOATS PER RACK are allowed.
- OCCUPY DATE- Assigned space(s) must be occupied on June 4, for both dock and land.
- Spaces not occupied on June 4 may be reassigned upon a resident's request for the vacant space. The Office will call the vacant space holder to advise them reassignment will be done, if after one week the space is not occupied. Extenuating circumstances will be considered.
- NO Waiting List will be maintained.
- Residents may SWAP SPACES after notifying the office and obtaining a replacement boat tag for the new space assigned.
- BOAT TAGS must be displayed or POA Security will padlock the boat until the proper tag is visible.
- HANDICAP accessible boat spaces will be available at all locations. A NJ state issued Handicap ID is required.
- CLEAN both your boat and trailer after it has been in another body of water before putting it back into WML.
- REMOVAL DATES- Boats & trailers must be removed before the following dates or the resident will incur a \$100 fine per boat, in addition to a \$10 penalty per boat/per day:

Dock Spaces- Monday, October 28, 2019 Land Spaces- Monday, November 18, 2019

FOR THE SAKE OF THE LAKE

More than one-third of our lake is filled by run off from streets and the surrounding land. Please do your part to prevent leaves, fertilizer, plastic and other trash entering our lake! Not only from lake front properties but from all of us in the community. There are Township Ordinances that prohibit blowing, raking or sweeping into the lake or into the street (Ord. 4.1.10 and 4.1.1 and 4.1.2). Remind your landscapers!

Also note, sump pump discharge from a private residence in White Meadow Lake must conform to the Rockaway Township ordinance(s), specifically not to discharge onto roadways or neighboring properties.

Sump pump discharge into the lake should ideally be done through a stabilized rock bed, at least ten feet from the lake edge, to allow sediment to fall out prior to water entry into the lake and to prevent freezing at the discharge point. A direct pipe from the sump pump to a rock bed is allowable, as this is typically intercepting ground water from a home's foundation and moving it away.

PERMITTED FISHING AREAS

Fishing is permitted along the clubhouse lawn from the corner of the dam railing to the boat docks. NO FISHING IS PERMITTED ON THE DAM WALL, BOAT DOCKS, SWIM DOCKS, OR SWIMMING AREAS.

- BEACH 1 No fishing is permitted at any time.
- BEACH 2 Fishing is permitted from the fishing dock south
 of the brook and the lawn area adjacent to the
 handball court. No fishing is permitted at beach
 areas or the north boat dock.
- BEACH 3 Fishing is permitted from the lawn adjacent to the dock and from the areas of the dock that are marked for fishing.

SEAS BASIC SAILING CLASS

Announcing 2019 Sailing Lessons

FOR ADULTS AND YOUTH AGES 9 AND UP

In the SEAS Basic Sailing Class, our instructors will take you from landlubber to seafarer through hands-on sailing experience and classroom sessions. In the classroom, you'll learn the fundamental knowledge necessary for getting started on a sailboat using the textbook published by the U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary, and then you'll be taken out on the water to apply your new knowledge and develop your sailing skills in a real-life, supervised, nautical setting.

Course includes 4 classroom sessions and 2 water sessions. Classroom sessions are: May 21, 23, 28, and 30 at the White Meadow Lake Clubhouse from 7:30 to 9:00 pm.

Water sessions are: May 25 and June 1 hosted at BUDD LAKE on SEAS.

Lessons are BY the SEAS Morris Sailing group. Graduates of the course get a membership with the SEAS organization as well as their certification. Continued opportunities to practice sailing skills on Budd Lake using the SEAS sailboats is a benefit of this membership.

SIGN UP AND PAY BY CHECK AT THE WML CLUBHOUSE - Registration is now to April 30 in the POA Office.

WML Members in good standing \$200. All other students \$225. Registration includes 2019 membership to SEAS Morris

NOTE – Youth under age 18 must be supervised by an adult at all times. The adult doesn't have to register and pay for the course but if they want to participate in any way (knot tying, water sessions) they need to register and pay. SEAS instructors recommend a person is at least 85 lbs to manage the sunfish sailboats independently, however SEAS instructors are willing to work with any youth ages 9 and up so long as they have the motivation to learn and can actively participate in all classroom and water sessions.

All participants must be able to swim and tread water over their head without a flotation device. Each person needs to bring their own "PFD" Personal Flotation Device.

A supervising (non-paying) parent/guardian will need to be present for all classroom and water sessions.
