Boat News

Saturday, April 8 • 8:00 am LAKE CLOSED

The lake is CLOSED to all fishing from Wednesday, April 5 at 4:00 pm until Saturday, April 8 at 8:00 am due to the fish stocking.

EARLY FALL LAKE LOWERING

The lake will be lowered for a major dam repair. Be ready to do any repairs to your lake front and clean out your lake front property.

PERMITTED FISHING AREAS

Fishing is permitted along the clubhouse lawn from the corner of the dam railing to the boat docks. NO FISHING IS PERMITTED ON THE DAM WALL, BOAT DOCKS, SWIM DOCKS, OR SWIMMING AREAS.

- BEACH 1 No fishing is permitted at any time.
- BEACH 2 Fishing is permitted from the fishing dock south
 of the brook and the lawn area adjacent to the
 handball court. No fishing is permitted at beach
 areas or the north boat dock.
- BEACH 3 Fishing is permitted from the lawn adjacent to the dock and from the areas of the dock that are marked for fishing.

FISHING REGULATIONS

As with all activities on POA property, POA members must display a current POA badge. Guests of POA members must be accompanied by the POA member and that member must have their Guest Pass Card available for WML Security to punch. All fishing regulations are NJ State Laws, not WML. A valid fishing license is required for NJ State residents ages 16 to 70. All non-residents of the state of New Jersey 16 years and older must have a valid fishing license. If you are trout fishing, a trout stamp is required.

LAKE COMMITTEE

- Boats CANNOT be in the designated swim areas.
- Pickerel should be CAUGHT AND NOT RELEASED.
- It is recommend that all kayaks and canoes have reflective tape on their paddles and hulls if they are on the water at dusk or later. Also, there should be a flashlight readily available when out on the water at dusk or later.
- To the boating public: All children need to be wearing a life jacket when on the water.

LAKEFRONT PROPERTY OWNERS

- For emergencies and lake consultant identification all lake front property owners must have their address posted on their docks and the lakeside of their property so that it is clearly visible from the water.
- The POA can remove any property owners dock based on guideline #12 in the "GUIDELINES FOR APPROVAL OF DOCKS AT WHITE MEADOW LAKE." www.whitemeadowlake.org

BOATING RULES & REGULATIONS

All boats and trailers must be NJ State Registered if they are entering our lake.

Boat tags are required for all boats used in WML. Dues must be paid in full to get a 2017 boat tag. NJ DMV Boat Registration & boat safety certificate are required to apply for a Boat Tag for gas or electric powered boats. Maximum Boat Length -16 ft. Maximum Horse Power - 9.9hp Clean both your boat and trailer, after it has been in another body of water before putting it back into White Meadow Lake. If boat tags are not displayed, we will chain the boat until the proper boat tag is displayed.

OCCUPY DATE

Assigned spot(s) must be occupied by May 1, both DOCK and ON LAND. If not occupied, your spot(s) will be revoked & reassigned **WITHOUT NOTICE**. If a resident has a valid reason their boat cannot be in its spot by May 1 please call the Office.

REMOVAL DATES

Boat(s) must be removed from spaces by the following dates or the boat owner will incur a \$100 fine, in addition to a \$10/day penalty per boat per WML Administrative Guidelines.

REMINDER TO BOATERS/FISHERMEN

Give Our Shorelines Space Please remember that as per POA Regulations, all boats must stay 50 feet away from shore properties, swimming areas and from the ropes at the POA Beaches. This is important to protect swimmers, wildlife and the peaceful enjoyment of homeowners and community members.

No Parking at the Boat Ramp

As a courtesy to others, please move your vehicle and trailer as quickly as possible when launching and removing your boat from the lake.

Remove Gas Cans and Standing Water

Please remove gas cans from boats when not in use. Check on your boat after rain storms and remove excess water. The standing water is creating a combination of a health hazard and sinking boats.

Anchors may damage the lake's alum and aeration system!

Please follow these guidelines to avoid causing costly damage to the lake's alum and aeration systems:

- Only use a mushroom-style anchor
- Do not drag anchor along lake bottom
- If you snag a line or observe a line on the lake surface:
 - Stop immediately!
 - Remove line from anchor
 - Call White Meadow Lake Security Truck 973-525-9075 or the POA office 973-627-5300.

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





SAFETY IN WHITE MEADOW LAKE

Driving has become a very hot topic in our community. Several drivers have been paying no mind to the posted speed limit signs and are speeding excessively, not yielding to buses, and driving carelessly without courtesy to other drivers, pedestrians, and residents.

We ask that all residents remember that there are a lot of children in the community and residents who walk and run on the streets in White Meadow Lake. Safety should be a top priority for everyone. When approaching a stopped bus, remember to stop until the bus turns its red lights off. Drivers, as a courtesy to other drivers, please use your blinkers to indicate which way you are turning.

Be a little more aware of your surroundings – it only takes a second to change someone's life.

Be Mindful! While drivers should stay alert at all times on the road, residents enjoying roadside activities around the lake also need to follow safety precautions.

PREVENT WATER CHESTNUTS Stop the Transport into our Lake!

Water chestnuts grow best in shallow lakes and rivers. With their rapid reproduction they can take over a small lake in a short amount of time. As they grow, the old leaves push further down the long stem, creating a thick cluster of leaves. Their dense growth makes navigation difficult and impedes the growth of other aquatic plants. The best way to eliminate the possible invasion of water chestnuts is simple: prevention. Follow the simple steps below to keep invasive plants out of our lake.

- Check your boat, trailer, equipment, clothing, wading boots, and buckets that have come in contact with the plant.
- Remove all visible mud, plants, fish or animals.
- Eliminate all water including water in small spaces.
- Before placing your boat back in the lake, wash it and let it dry in the sun for 2-3 days.
- · NEVER transport plants or fish from one body of water to another.
- Clean your boat using one of the following methods:
 - -Hot or salt water. Allow surfaces to dry.
 - -100% vinegar solution for 20 minutes.
 - -1% table salt solution for 24 hours.

KEEP OUR LAKE CLEAN

- Do not feed the Lake reduce or eliminate lawn fertilizers, and don't fertilize your lawn unless a soil test indicates.
- Do not dump lawn clippings or other waste in the lake or near the shoreline -- compost instead.


