#### FIRST ANNUAL MEETING Wednesday, September 9 • 8:00 pm **Presentation of Budget & Nominating Committee Report**

Pages 9-12 contains the POA Preliminary Budget, as approved by the Board of Directors for introduction to the White Meadow Lake POA membership.

This budget will be introduced at the First Annual Meeting on Wednesday, September 9. A quorum of 50 members in good standing is required to start our annual meeting. In the event 50 members are not present to reach a quorum after 20 minutes, the members present may choose to waive the 50 member quorum rule and start the meeting with a smaller quorum. The Nominating Committee will present their report and slate of candidates for the 2020-2021 Officers and Directors positions. The current open positions are: President, First Vice President, Second Vice President, Treasurer, and four 3 year Directors' seats. Residents in good standing may also make nominations from the floor. During this 1st Annual Meeting, members will have the opportunity to ask questions about, make comments on, and take part in the formation of the 2021 Budget.

#### SYNOPSIS OF AUGUST **BOARD MEETING**

- Approved motion to open the preschool for the 2020-2021 season with a 10% tuition increase to ensure the financial loss of doing so should be no greater than \$6,000 of the cost to keep the school closed. This increase will override the previously passed budget & will be revised to reflect any changes to income & expenses.
- Revisited Legal & By Laws Motion from the July board meeting. Motion will be reworded for September meeting.
- Purchased insulation from Home Depot for the Preschool roof at a cost of \$1,362.67.
- Motion to replace dump truck body & receiver mounted salt spreader for up to \$13,000 from Equalization Fund will be revisited at September Board Meeting.
- Approved motion to transfer \$50,000 from POA budget line 542.01 into the Capital Improvement Fund.
- Approved motion to transfer \$30,000 from POA budget line 542.02 into the Sinking Fund.
- Approved application for household membership (2)
- Both motions to obtain POA Board approval for the following ballot question & explanation to be put to the community at the second annual meeting were defeated:

Question: Should the WML POA spend up to \$500K to replace the existing six tennis courts with five tennis courts & two dedicated pickleball courts including fencing, net posts, nets & permit fees? Monies to cover this project would come from the Capital Improvement (\$200K) & Sinking Fund (\$300K).

Question: Should the POA spend up to \$350,000 to replace 3 tennis courts including fencing, net posts, nets & permit fees. Money to come from the Capital Improvement Fund (\$150,000) & Sinking Fund (\$200,000). If this motion passes & gets 2/3 votes, it supersedes any other tennis court motion. The other 3 courts will be demoed.

#### PERMITTED FISHING AREAS

Fishing is permitted along the clubhouse lawn from the corner of the dam railing to the boat docks. NO FISHING IS PERMITTED ON THE DAM WALL, BOAT DOCKS, SWIM DOCKS, OR SWIMMING AREAS.

- BEACH 1 No fishing is permitted at any time.
- BEACH 2 Fishing is permitted from the fishing dock south
   of the brook and the lawn area adjacent to the
   handball court. No fishing is permitted at beach
   areas or the north boat dock.
- BEACH 3 Fishing is permitted from the lawn adjacent to the dock and from the areas of the dock that are marked for fishing.

#### FISHING REGULATIONS

As with all activities on POA property, POA members must display a current POA badge. Guests of POA members must be accompanied by the POA member and that member must have their Guest Pass Card available for WML Security to punch. All fishing regulations are NJ State Laws, not WML. A valid fishing license is required for NJ State residents ages 16 to 69. A senior license is available for residents ages 65-69. All non-residents of the state of New Jersey 16 years and older must have a valid fishing license. If you are trout fishing, a trout stamp is required.

#### **BOAT REMOVAL DATES**

Boats & trailers must be removed before the following dates or the resident will incur a \$100 fine per boat, in addition to a \$10 penalty per boat/per day:

Dock Spaces - Monday, October 26 Land Spaces - Monday, November 16

#### WINTER BOAT STORAGE

All POA members in good standing are now given the opportunity to keep their boats in the Beach 2 parking lot over the winter. Sign up at the POA Office starting Saturday, September 12. Certain rules and restrictions apply:

- 1. Current dues, past dues and penalties must be paid in full.
- Storage spots will be assigned on a 1st come, 1st serve basis at the POA Office.
- 3. There is a \$250 yearly assessment fee. There is also a \$100 security deposit that will be refunded if the boat and trailer are removed from the parking lot by May 4, 2021 .
- 4. Valid registrations for both the boat and the trailer must be provided. POA Boat Stickers must be visible at all times (Right Rear).
- A homeowners insurance certificate showing boat and trailer insurance coverage must be provided. The boat owner must sign a waiver absolving the POA of any liability.
- 6. Boats will be parked on the beach side of the Beach 2 parking lot.
- 7. Boats can be placed in the spot starting October 10.

All watercrafts (paddle boards, kayaks, inflatables, etc) in White Meadow Lake MUST have a 2020 sticker.
Children under 12 years of age in boats, MUST WEAR U.S.COAST GUARD approved life vests at all times.



#### ABSENTEE BALLOT REQUESTS

If you would like to receive your Absentee Ballot Packet by mail, please use the Absentee Request Form below. This form must be received in the POA office by mail no later than Thursday, October 1 or you may request an Absentee Ballot Packet in person at the POA office until Friday, October 9 by 4:30 pm. 1 vote per household.

All ballots <u>MUST BE RETURNED</u> to the POA Office <u>NO LATER THAN 12:00PM ON Saturday, October 10</u> for your vote to count.

It is the sole responsibility of the property owner to ensure that the ballot is received by the office no later than 1 hour prior to the close of business on the last day prior to the election.

If not returned (filled or blank) the vote is forfeited and the member will not be allowed to vote on the day of the election.

Ballot can only be picked up by the voter or mailed to the address directly. If anyone other than the voter is requesting your Absentee Ballot, please allow time for delivery by mail.

Please refer to Section 7 of our constitution for guidelines regarding the use of Absentee Ballots.

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
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

WML EARLY DAYS by Billy Silvershien

As White Meadow Lake reaches its fiftieth anniversary on July 1, 1998, Bennett Silvershein has composed the following reflections on the history of the community. The beginnings of White Meadow go back to the 1930s. Benjamin Kline, an immigrant from Russia, saw an opportunity when the Lincoln Tunnel opened. He foresaw the demand for leisure communities in New Jersey. Mr. Kline developed a number of summer communities including Lake Hiawatha, in Parsippany. The hardships of the depression became a springboard for those earning a decent living to search for relief from the hot city of New York. The Catskills, Jersey Shore, and the mountains of New Jersey, became the refuge for these people. Lakewood, West Orange, Bradley Beach, Asbury Park, Lake Hopatcong, and Mount Freedom, became their playground. Many wives and children spent the entire summer in these areas. Husbands commuted on weekends for their own vacations. With foresight, Mr. Kline saw this trend and developed the second home concept. Instead of renting, why not own? These costs were almost the same. In the 1930s, a partial swampy tract in Parsippany became Lake Hiawatha. By placing a dam at one end of a tributary to the Rockaway River, he created a lake. The location was ideal. It was only half the traveling time to the successful rental summer communities. In addition, it provided all the amenities of the resorts. Lack of funds, and the Second World War, put a stop to continuation of the concept of second homes. The nation devoted itself to the war effort. Development stopped and with gas rationing, it became impossible to afford the luxury of using a car for anything but necessities. At the end of the war, Mr. Kline renewed his interest in second home communities. In 1945, he acquired the property now known as White Meadow Lake. It consisted of approximately 2,000 acres and included an estate house, now the major portion of the club house, the lake, an old hunting cabin, and the original estate house. With his two sons, Morton and Norman, National House and Farm Association became the developers of White Meadow. Their interests were in developing the roads and supporting utilities. They merchandised the land by offering a dream to people. For only pennies a day, the property to build a second home was now affordable. In 1946 there were no planning requirements. Developers and subdividers had no constraints. To their credit, the Klines established a set of standards that later became the basis for our present day zoning. Since its inception, the only rule that has changed substantially is that minimum lots can no longer have 60 feet of frontage. In the beginning, the construction of homes was secondary. Of paramount importance was the sale of lots. The customers were people who prospered with the national economy and had the ability to provide their families with vacations. Veterans entered college through the GI Bill. The government provided financing for home purchases. There was a striving for upward mobility. Victory gave everyone the confidence to create a better world, a world that would take people from their immigrant roots, to new heights of assimilation. With this in mind, the Klines were on their way to developing what at the time was considered to be a luxury. No one could have realized the prosperity and urban sprawl that would be created.


